



City of Fort Pierce Launches Community Needs Assessment Survey and Public Meetings 2026 – 2030 U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Community Development Block Grant

The City of Fort Pierce is developing its 2026–2030 Consolidated Plan to address community needs. This five-year plan outlines how U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds will be used over the next five program years.

The Consolidated Plan serves as a strategic blueprint for the city, identifying key priorities such as infrastructure improvements, public services, affordable housing, and economic and community development. It reflects the needs of Fort Pierce residents and is approved by the City Commission before being submitted to HUD for review and funding approval. Community input is vital to this process, ensuring that federal resources are allocated effectively to enhance the quality of life in Fort Pierce.

The survey will be accessible in English, French, and Spanish on the City of Fort Pierce website from **March 9, 2026, to April 8, 2026.**

In addition, the city will host in-person public meetings in support of the Citizen Participation Plan, Annual Action Plan, and Consolidated Plan. These meetings provide residents an opportunity to participate and share input in person on the following dates: **April 16, 2026; April 30, 2026; and May 14, 2026.** All meetings will be held at the Riverwalk Center, 600 N. Indian River Drive, Fort Pierce, FL at **5:30PM**
